Dr 37, Trier. The basal band of corded beads was used by potters of Werkstatt II (Fölzer 1913, Taf 20, nos 6, 12, 15), and a similar band was later used by Dubitatus (Gard 1937, Taf 20, 5-6a). Later C2-early C3, probably; the footring is not notably late in style.

Dr 37, Rheinzabern. The rosette, Ricken & Fischer 1963, 447, was shared by several potters. Later C2-first half C3.

KW69 Ω U/S Dr 37, Central Gaul. Feet of small human figure, not certainly identifiable. Early C2.

Dr 30 in the style of Doecous of Lezoux. Ovolo, beads and festoon as Stanfield & Simpson 1958, pl 149, no 32. The motif in the festoon is ~~probably the stag on pl 149~~, no 33. c AD 165-200. (Very abraded)

Dr 37, East Gaul. The ovolo is probably Fölzer 1913, Taf 25, no 124, which was used by Sacer of La Madeleine (Haalebos 1977, Taf 41, no 200, and Fölzer Taf 1, no 38, both with the C.C.SACRI stamp). Hadrianic-early Antonine. (2 sherds, one from Ω $\frac{3}{V}$).

Dr 37, Rheinzabern. The cupid, Ricken & Fischer 1963, M126, and doubled medallion (K20 or 20a) were shared by Comitialis VI and Belsus III, but their use with tendrils as here occurs only on Comitialis' bowls (Ludowici & Ricken 1948, Taf 106, no 10, Taf 107, no 6). Later C2-first half C3.

KW69 Ω E/M Dr 30, Central Gaul, with large beads characteristic of the Doecous-Casurius group. mid-late Antonine.

KW69 Ω $\frac{3}{II}$ Dr 45, Trier, with lion-head spout: cf Bird 1986, no 2.215. First half C3. AHM: Trier, variety d of its type, mid B. In Britain, one at Silchester & probably one at Bullington.

KW68 $\frac{2}{B}$ 5 Dr 37 in the style of Geminus of Lezoux. The ovolo, wavy line and triple leaf are on Stanfield & Simpson 1958, pl 66, no 20. c AD 125-145.

KW68 $\frac{3}{B}$ 2 Pl Dr 37 in the style of X-13 (Donnaucus) of Les Martres-de-Veyre. The little cupid is on Stanfield & Simpson 1958, pl 49, no 577, the other figure is probably that on pl 44, no 511. The motif at each side of the cupid may be a small duck; that above is the panther on pl 45, no 518. c AD 100-125. (Slightly burnt, worn inside. The detail is rather blurred, probably from the finishing)

KW68 $\frac{3}{B}$ 6 Dr 29, South Gaul. Small column supporting festoons in the upper zone. • Neronian, probably.

KW68 4 B 12 Dr 30 probably, Central Gaul. Possible foliage motif. Hadrianic-Antonine.
